SEP 8, 1938 - AUG 16, 2015

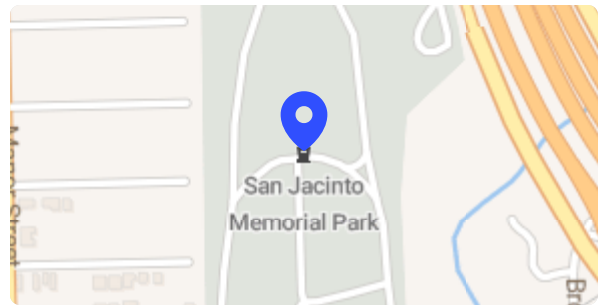

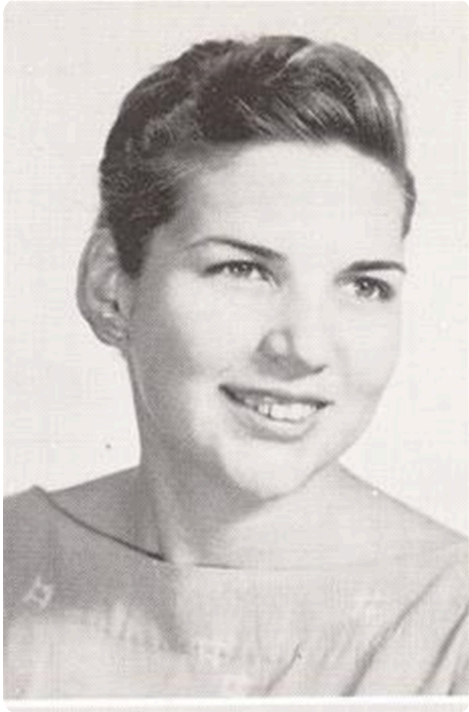
