Nuestro querido J Ascencion Garcia nos dejo el 13 de febrero de 2026 en Houston, Texas. Nació el 5 de mayo de 1940 en México, hijo de Juan García y Trinidad Vargas. Desde joven, su vida estuvo marcada por la humildad, la fortaleza y un profundo sentido de responsabilidad, valores que lo guiaron siempre y que dejó sembrados en cada generación que hoy lo honra.

J Ascencion Garcia, age 85, of Houston, Texas, passed away on February 13, 2026, leaving behind a legacy woven from love, resilience, and the countless lives he touched. Born on May 5, 1940, in Mexico to Juan Garcia and Trinidad Vargas, Ascencion grew up with a spirit shaped by humility, hard work, and deep devotion to family—values he carried with him throughout his life.

On December 16, 1969, he married the love of his life, Maria Guadalupe Medina, in Mexico. Their marriage was a true partnership, a bond strengthened by faith, laughter, and the joys and challenges of raising a large, close-knit family. Together, they built a home filled with music, warmth, and unwavering support.

Ascencion worked as a construction drywall professional for 35 years, a trade in which he poured his strength, skill, and pride. His hands built more than walls—they built opportunities, stability, and a foundation for generations to come. Though he has reunited with them, his absence leaves a profound ache in the hearts of those who remain.

He will be remembered for his gentle spirit, his music that filled rooms with warmth, his hands that built and repaired, and his unwavering devotion to the family he cherished above all else. His presence was a blessing, his love a gift, and his memory will continue to shine brightly in the lives of all who knew him.

He will be greatly missed.

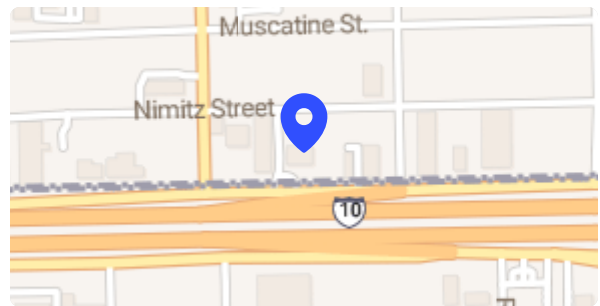

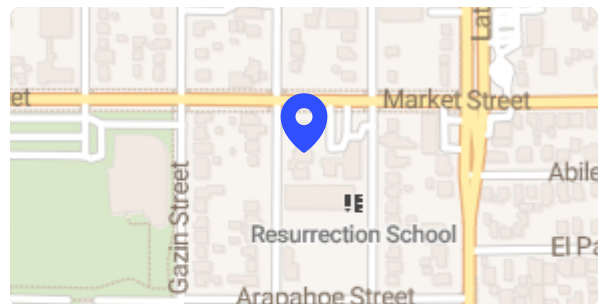

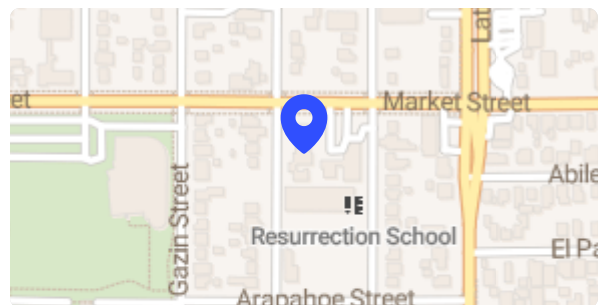
